COURSE FORMAT

The TEFL course is 120 hours in total, spanning four weeks. The timetable is from 9.30-18.30 Monday to Friday and the course gives homework and project work to be completed outside the classroom. The course is intense yet perfectly organised so that each student can complete the work within the four-week timetable as long as they keep to the plan laid out by the course trainers.



TEACHING PRACTICES

There are 6 teaching practices, which cover all levels of English (beginner to advanced) and include individual and group classes. All teaching practices are observed and include detailed feedback by experienced TEFL trainers. The teaching practices are carried out in the same building.



TYPE OF ASSESSMENT

The course is assessed through weekly projects, a main project and a final exam. This is all externally moderated and approved by the accreditation board.



COURSE LOCATION AND CENTRE

The TEFL centre is located in the middle of Madrid and is modern and bright. There are big classrooms for the TEFL training and the teaching practices are carried out in the same building in classrooms to suit smaller group sizes – ideal for teaching group English classes.



REQUIREMENTS

To do the TEFL course you will need to have a degree and be over 21 years old (although each case is considered on a case by case basis). You can also be a non-native speaker of English as long as you have a level C1 or above, which will be tested during the interview. You do not need to speak or understand Spanish to do the course or teach TEFL in Madrid.



JOB MARKET AND EMPLOYMENT POSSIBILITY

The TEFL market in Madrid and Spain is well-established and has plenty of work. Our TEFL partner has contacts at all of the agencies and academies in the city and further afield so that you will be able to find work easily, and also in the field you would like.



VISA REQUIREMENTS

EU passport holders can live and work in Spain without restrictions. For Non-EU passport holders you will need a visa to live, study and work in Spain for longer than 3 months. Many TEFL providers allow their students to come to Spain and stay illegally after the three month period, however, TEFL Connect provides a course that allows non-EU passport holders a university visa for a year, which includes Spanish classes, Ongoing Professional Development and you can legally work as many hours as you like, anywhere you like. You not only receive your Advanced TEFL Certificate but learn a new language as well!

WORK IN MADRID

Madrid is the modern and metropolitan capital of Spain, and is ideal for those wishing to immerse themselves in the culture and language of Spain and experience something extraordinary during their time abroad.
