



Teach English in
Peru



COURSE FORMAT

You'll study for 150 hours over the 4 week training period. You will also complete 12 hours of teaching practises with real students. It's a full time, Monday to Friday program, with weekends off.



TEACHING PRACTICES

You'll teach local Peruvian students during your practical sessions, usually in groups of 10 students. All classes are with local learners, who are keen to expand upon their English knowledge.



TYPE OF ASSESSMENT

You will complete 2 academic papers, a final portfolio, along with your observed teaching practises during the program.



COURSE LOCATION AND CENTRE

The training centre is in the heart of Cusco, on the Avenida El Sol. It's 3 blocks from the historical centre, close to shops, cafes and nightlife. You have air conditioning, WiFi, a computer lab and an onsite snack bar.



REQUIREMENTS

To complete the TEFL course you need to be at least 18 years old (although each applicant is considered on a case by case basis). You can also be a non-native speaker of English as long as you have a level C1 or above, which will be tested during the interview. A Bachelors degree (in any discipline) is preferred, however there are plenty of TEFL jobs for non degree holders.



JOB MARKET AND EMPLOYMENT POSSIBILITY

New positions are available every month, year-round. Demand for English teachers is so high that TEFL graduates can immediately begin their career teaching English right after the course. TEFL graduates find opportunities working with adults and teens in both private institutes and public school settings. In Cusco, Arequipa, Trujillo, Chiclayo, and of course Lima, there are thousands of private English institutes and K-12 schools.



VISA REQUIREMENTS

You'll enter Peru on a 180 day visa on arrival. Following the course, your employer will assist you with renewing your visa.

WORK IN PERU

Peruvians place a high value on academic credentials and they are always looking to advance their English language skills to remain competitive in the international market. The Peruvian culture holds "profes" in high esteem and you should be prepared to take your role seriously.

Graduates find opportunities working with adults and teens in both private institutes and public school settings. In Cusco, Arequipa, Trujillo, Chiclayo, and of course Lima, there are thousands of private English institutes and K-12 schools. Those who can commit to a minimum of 1 year can obtain positions in K-12 schools, meanwhile teachers who prefer to commit for only 3-12 months find opportunities in language schools.

Private institutes hire year-round. K-12 schools follow the Latin American school year and tend to hire between January and February. Most TEFL teachers work 25-30 hours per week, although total hours and curriculum standards differ between employers.

Average pay per month for a TEFL teacher in Peru is \$400-\$550 USD per month.



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Peru is a truly stunning country that is equal parts beautiful, historic, and ambitious. It is truly one of the great success stories in South America and it keeps getting better.

The training centre sits directly across from Q'oricancha – the Temple of the Sun and the most sacred site in the Inca Empire. The city of Cusco is most famous for its interesting mix of Inca ruins and colonial architecture – so much so the entire city has been designated an UNESCO World Heritage Site by the United Nations.
